SWEET POTATO AUCTION

One of the raised garden beds had vigorous growth for months but as it held sweet potato plants it was not known how many sweet potatoes would be dug up. It was decided to take the plunge and have an auction of what was found. The photo above shows Jenny our auctioneer at work. As the photo below shows a great bounty was unearthed. The sweet potato auction that was held in June was well attended with funds raised. The jumbo potato weighed 4.5kg and was sold for \$10.



PLANT OF THE MONTH

The sweet potato is a semitropical plant that grows best between 20° and 30° in well drained loamy soil. Sweet potatoes can be cooked in many ways, such as baked and roasted and cubed in casseroles, curries and patties. Sweet potato fries and mash are great alternatives to the usual white potato and they are high in vitamin A and

other vitamins and minerals. Try coconut cream and lime juice with your sweet potato mash.

RECENT WORK

A work party from Wooroloo came to the garden in May. For the Friends of Nyaania Creek group they built up a lining of rockwork in sections of the creek and mulched around the young native plants along the bank. In the community garden the work party mowed and whipper snipped. They also mended the straw bale seats which had been damaged.
